This introduces general elementary school life in Japan. It depends on the area you live in and the school you go to. If you have any questions, consult with your local government or school teacher.

★ School system

- O There are public and private schools.
- O The school year is from April to March next year.
- As for holidays, there are Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays, summer holidays (Late July to August), winter holidays (Late December to early January) and spring holidays (Late March to early April).
- O There is no repeat grade, so classmates are the same age.
- O Textbooks are free of charge. (There is a charge for reference books.)
- The number of class hours per day and the time to go home are different depending on the day of the week and the grade.

- O Please contact your homeroom teacher frequently.
- O It is better to make friends with Japanese parents so that you can consult them when you are in trouble.
- O Please create opportunities to study at preschool (Initial Japanese Language Instruction for Pre-School Students) and Japanese language classes.

Please cherish your native language

- At home, parents should use the language they are best at.
 It is said that if the language at home grows well,
 Japanese also grows well.
- O If a child can think about abstract words and concepts in his native language, he can understand them by replacing them with his native language, even if he doesn't understand them in Japanese.
- O What you can do at home to foster a child's native language
- Create an environment connected to native culture such as letters, food, costumes, photos, music, movies and dramas.
- Please read a book to your child.
- If there is a native language class, please let your child go.
